

- This Operation Manual describes the operation and maintenance of Model UJF-3042MkII/UJF-3042MkII EX/6042MkII Color Ink Jet Printer (hereinafter referred to as the machine).
- The illustration of UJF-3042MkII is used in the explanation of this manual.
- Please read and fully understand this Operation Manual before putting the machine into service. It is also necessary to keep this Operation Manual on hand.
- Make arrangements to deliver this Operation Manual to the person in charge of the operation of this machine.
- This Operation Manual has been carefully prepared for your easy understanding, however, please do not hesitate to contact your local distributor, our sales office, or service center if you have any inquiry.
- Description contained in this Operation Manual are subject to change without notice for improvement.
- In the case where this Operation Manual should be illegible due to destruction or lost by fire or breakage, purchase another copy of the Operation Manual from our office.

### **Symbols**

Symbols are used in this Operation Manual for safe operation and for prevention of damage to the machine. The indicated sign is different depending on the content of caution.

### Cautions for constructing exhaust outlet.

Please observe the following cautions to avoid breakdown of this machine.

- (1) The opening area of the exhaust outlet requires more than half of the duct entrance area.
- (2) If mounting a valve on the exhaust outlet, be sure to open the valve when using the machine.



 The included power cable set can be used with this machine only. This power cable set cannot be used with any other electrical devices. To prevent a fire or electric shock, do not use any power cable set other than the one included.



 The ink used for this machine falls into the category of UN No.3082 and UN Class 9.
 Since the ink is flammable, never use fire when using the machine.



 When cleaning the heads, be sure to wear the included safety glasses and gloves.



 The gloves supplied with the machine are disposable. When all the gloves are expended, purchase an equivalent product on the market.



- If anyone swallows ink or cleaning solution in mistake, get the person to vomit and see a doctor immediately. Do not let him or her swallow the vomit. Then, refer SDS about the inquiry.
- If you inhale a lot of vapor and feel bad, immediately move to a location of fresh air and then keep yourself warm and quiet. Then, consult a doctor as soon as possible.
- Discard the waste ink according to the local regulations of the area that this machine is used



- The set of power cables provided with this machine is for use with this machine only, and cannot be used with other electrical devices.
   Do not use any power cables other than the ones provided with the machine. Failure to observe those instructions may result in fire or electric shocks.
- Take care not to damage, break or work upon the power cable. If a heavy material is placed on the power cable, or if it is heated or pulled, the power cable can break, thus resulting in fire or electric shocks.
- Do not use this machine in an environment where humidity is high or the machine may get wet. Using the machine under such environment may result in fire or electric shock, or cause malfunction.

### WARNING



- Use of the machine under an abnormal condition where it produces smoke or strange smell can result in fire or electric shocks. - Keep the power plug prong clear of any foreign object such as a piece of metal. Failure to do so may result in a fire or electric shocks.
- Do not plug too may leads into a single socket.
   Doing so may result in fire or electric shocks.
- Do not use the machine if the power cord or plug is damaged. Using the machine with damaged power cord may result in fire or electric shocks. Contact your service representative for replacement cord.
- Do not handle the power plug with wet hands.Doing so may result in electric shocks.
- Grasp by holding the plug itself when removing the power plug from wall outlet, and never hold by the cord. Holding and pulling the cord may damage the cord, leading to fire or electric shocks.
- To prevent a fire or electric shock, do not use the device at a power supply voltage other than the one indicated.
- To prevent a fire or electric shock, do not use the device at a power supply frequency other than the one indicated.
- Keep your fingers and other body parts away from dangerous moving parts of the device.

### Do not disassemble or remodel the machine



 Never disassemble or remodel this machine and the ink bottle.

Disassembling or remodeling any of them will result in electric shocks or breakdown of this machine.

### Power supply and voltage



Use this machine with indicated power specifications.

Be sure to connect the power cable plug to the grounded outlet, or it may cause fire or electric shock.



- Never look at the LED UV being lit with your naked eyes, or it may cause pain in your eyes or visual impairment. Be sure to wear safety glasses.
- Do not apply ultraviolet (UV) light directly to your skin, or it may cause irritation on your skin.



- To prevent electrical shock, be sure to set OFF the main power circuit breaker and disconnect the power plug before carrying out maintenance. For some units, capacitors may take one minute for discharging; therefore, start maintenance work three minutes after setting OFF the main power circuit breaker and disconnecting the power plug.
- If LED UV has been damaged, you should replace the LED UV that has reached or has past its rating life.



- The main power circuit breaker should be set ON only by personnel with sufficient knowledge about operations of this machine.
- Do not touch the lamp with bare hands while lighting or right after the lamp off to avoid from burn injury.



 Although this machine is a Class 1 laser device, its laser sensors are equipped with Class 2 lasers. Never look directly at the laser light, as it can make your eyes hurt or damage your eyesight.



### Do not use this machine in damp places



 Avoid damp environment to use this machine.
 Do not splash water onto this machine. High humidity or water will give rise to fire, electric shocks or breakdown of this machine.

### Abnormal event occurs



- If the machine is used under an abnormal condition where the machine produces smoke or unpleasant smell, fire or electric shocks can result. Be sure to turn off the power switch immediately and detach the plug from the receptacle. Check first to be sure that the machine no longer produces smoke, and contact a distributor in your district for repair.
- Never repair your machine by yourself since it is very dangerous for you to do so.

### Handling of ink bottles



- Some of the ingredients (UV Curing initiator) have toxic consequences to aquatic life. Avoid leak into water system or sewage containing water.
- Store ink bottles and waste ink tank in a place that is out of the reach of children.
- If ink settles on the skin or clothes, immediately wash it off with detergent or water. If you get ink in your eyes, immediately wash your eyes with a lot of clean water, and then consult a doctor as soon as possible.

### Handling of LED UV



- Do not use the machine in a flammable atmosphere (such as gasoline, flammable sprays, thinners, lacquers, dust, etc.). It may cause a fire or electric shock by ignition.
- Do not bring paper or cloth close to the LED UV unit or cover LED UV unit with it. Doing so may cause fire.

### Handling of the antifreeze liquid



- Use the exclusive antifreeze liquid, or the cooling device may be damaged.
- Do not directly touch the antifreeze liquid. If the antifreeze liquid or mixed soft water with antifreeze liquid gets on the skin or clothes, immediately wash it off with soap.
- If you get the antifreeze liquid in your eyes, immediately wash your eyes with a lot of clean water. Then, consult a doctor as soon as possible.
- Before using the antifreeze liquid, be sure to read the Safety Data Sheet (SDS).
- If you swallowed the antifreeze liquid accidentally, try to get to vomit, and then consult a doctor as soon as possible.
- Discard the waste antifreeze liquid or used mixed soft water with antifreeze liquid as follows;

Absorb in a sawdust or waste cloth, then incinerate it.

Entrust to an industrial waste disposal contractor, clarifying their contents.

 Avoid causing ignition with static electricity, impact spark and so on.



 Be sure to wear safety glasses and gloves for handling the antifreeze liquid.

### **Circulating water**



 If you find any water leaks on the maintenance parts, turn the power switch off immediately, and remove the power plug from the power socket

### Note on maintenance



 When cleaning the ink-station or the heads, be sure to wear the included safety glasses and gloves.



 The gloves supplied with the machine are disposable. When all the gloves are expended, purchase an equivalent product on the market.



- Keep ink away from an open flame. Also keep the room well ventilated when you use or handle ink.
- If you get ink in your eyes, immediately wash your eyes with a lot of clean water for at least 15 minutes. In doing so, also wash eyes to rinse ink away completely. Then, consult a doctor as soon as possible.
- If anyone drinks ink by mistake, keep him or her quiet and see a doctor immediately. Do not allow him or her to swallow the vomit.
- Then contact the emergency number written in SDS.
- If you inhale a lot of vapor and feel bad, immediately move to a location of fresh air and then keep yourself warm and quiet. Then, consult a doctor as soon as possible.
- If the ink adheres to your skin, use a large amount of water and soap or special detergent.

### **CAUTION**

### Warning labels



 Warning labels are adhered on this machine.
 Be sure to fully understand the warnings given on the labels. In the case where any of the warning label has become so soiled that the warning message is illegible or has come off, purchase a new one from your local distributor or our office.

### Ink bottles



- If the ink bottle is moved from a cold place to a warm place, leave it in a place of use for three hours or more and use it.
- Open the ink bottle just before installing.
   Leaving it open for a long time will cause abnormal printing.
- Be sure to store ink bottles in a cold and dark place.
- Once the ink opened, be sure to use ink up early. The ink passed for a long time after opening the bottle will lower the printing quality.

### **M** CAUTION



- Using other than exclusive ink will break this machine. In this case, repairing of this machine is your responsibility.
- · Never refill the ink bottle with ink.

on the printer, dust can put on it.

 Do not pound the ink bottle nor shake it violently. If so, ink may leak out of the bottle.

### Protection against dust



- It is strongly recommended to use the machine in a room that is not dusty.
   Set the Refresh level 2 or 3 when in bad
- environment.Do not forget to close the front cover before going home in the evening. If any media is left
- Store media not to put dust on it. Wiping dust off the media, dust will be put on the media due to static electricity.

### Handling of cleaning solution



 Be sure to store the cleaning solution in a cold and dark place. Store the cleaning solution in a place that is out of the reach of children.

### Handling the antifreeze liquid



- Be sure to store the antifreeze liquid in a cold and dark place.
- Store the antifreeze liquid in a place that is out of the reach of children.

### Hot parts



 The LED UV device and the hot water will have a very high temperature. When carrying out maintenance, wait until the temperature has been sufficiently lowered after the lamp is turned OFF.



 When it is unavoidable to touch hot parts, be sure to wear heat-insulating gloves to protect your hands.

### Power supply



- Leave the breaker turned ON.
- Do not turn off the main power switch on the right side of this machine.

### UV light



- A little UV light spills around the LED UV unit.
   UV light applied to your skin might cause inflammation and/or skin cancer.
- Even weak UV light causing no inflammation may lead to chronic disorders by repeated exposure. Avoid applying UV light to your skin and eyes.



- Impairment of eyes caused by UV light may be acute disorders, pain in eyes, tearing, chronic disorders, cataract, etc.
- When using this machine, protect your body such as gloves, long-sleeve cloth, light-resistant mask, attached light-resistant glasses, etc.

### **CAUTION**

### Notes on LED UV



 When handling the glass on the bottom of the LED UV unit, be sure to wear the gloves attached and never touch them with bare hands. Or the UV ink curing level may significantly lower. If the glass becomes dirty, wipe it with clean gauze moistened with alcohol. (Do not use alcohol for cleaning the exterior cover, or the paint will peel off.)



 The LED UV performance and service life are significantly affected by the UV irradiation and UV power supply units used. Never use those UV devices other than those recommended by Mimaki. We would take no responsibility for any troubles caused through the use of a UV devices not recommended by Mimaki.

### Cleaning



- After using this machine long time, foreign materials and dust may be gathered on the conductive and insulating parts, causing electric leakage. Periodically clean such parts.
- For cleaning, do not use compressed air because it scatters foreign materials and dust, which may cause malfunctions when put inside the conductive parts. Be sure to use vacuum cleaner to vacuum off foreign materials and dust.
- Do not use the machine in a place where there is a possibility of being wet, or electricity may leak.
- Electrical leakage may lead to electrical shock of personnel or fire.
- To prevent accidents, be sure to carry out periodic inspections and replace periodic replacement parts.

### Periodic exchange parts



 There are some parts which must be periodically replaced. Contract with distributors or dealers for maintenance.

### Adjusting the level



Keep this machine horizontal.

### Firing and smoking



 Touching hot parts such as the LED UV with combustible materials may cause firing and/or smoking.

Leaving combustible materials under the LED UV unit for a couple of minutes may also cause firing and/or smoking.

### **CAUTION**




- After this machine is used long time, foreign materials or dust gathered may cause electrical leakage, or insulation deterioration may cause firing and/or smoking. Periodically clean this machine and replace the deteriorated parts after the insulation resistance.
- After this machine is used long time, screws or others on the conductive parts may be loosened, causing firing and/or smoking.
   Periodically tighten the screws.
- This machine is not an explosion-proof type.
   Do not use the machine in a flammable atmosphere. There is a danger of explosion.
- If abnormalities such as a strange odor, a smoking or a spark burn occurred, turn the power off and call our office immediately.

### Safety interlock


This machine is equipped with interlocks to terminate the operation for your safety when the cover opens during printing etc. (red circle parts in the figure below).

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
### Installing the machine

### Where to install the machine

Secure sufficient space for installation before assembling this machine.

Decide the place considering the size of the machine and a space required for printing.

- When you usually use photographic fixer, do not install this machine in a room filled with vapor of photographic fixer. If you install this machine in such a room, ink adhering to the head hardens and it may cause image quality defect that cannot be improved even if you perform head cleaning many times and may cause nozzle clogging.
- Besides photographic fixer, if you leave this machine in an environment where acidic vapor (acetic acid, muriatic acid, etc.) is generated, the same phenomenon occurs.
- Do not use this machine in environments where cutting fluid or other volatile substances are present in large quantities (e.g., amines, modified amine alcohol). Additionally, keep this machine, ink, and maintenance kit away from such environments. Disregarding this precaution may result in nozzle clogging.

### Moving this machine

Move this machine as follows when this machine is required to move on the step-free same floor.




- When moving this machine, take care not to give a significant impact on it.
- When moving this machine, keep it as flatly as possible. Do not move it on its side. It may cause machine failure.
- The dedicated stand of this machine includes leveling feet to secure the machine.
   Before turning the power ON, make sure that the printer body is fixed with the leveling feet.
   The printer body may start moving during operation if it is not fixed with the leveling feet.




### Before moving this machine, install the handles for transporting. (two places)

Insert the handles into this machine, and fix them tightening screws.



### For safety, be sure to work it with more than 4 people.


Do not push the cover to move this machine since the cover may be deformed. Be sure to hold the handles for transporting when moving the machine. Comply with local regulations when moving the product.

Below is an illustration of UJF-3042MkII.




### Carriage

A print head for printing, LED UV device, and a light pointer in the print head cover are mounted on the carriage.






- Do not look directly at the LED UV light with the naked eye, even if it is through the front cover.
   This light can be extremely bright depending on the printing conditions.
- · Use the accompanying light-shielding glasses.



### **EMERGENCY SWITCH**

One EMERGENCY switch is placed on the front face of the unit and one is placed on the right side in the rear part of the cover.

When stopping the machine for safety reason, press the switch.





- The emergency switch on 3042MkII is optional.
- To your use this option, you will need a mounting work by our service engineers.
   Please note that the optional accessories can not be attached by the customer.



When you press the emergency switch and the machine stops, be sure to follow the procedures below:


- (1) Disconnect from the outlet before resolving the fault.
- (2) After checking the safety, pull the emergency switch upward (or rotate) to release.
- (3) Connect to the outlet.



### ENTER key

Registers the last input value as the setting value or goes to the immediate lower level of the hierarchy.



- The [ENTER] key under the operation panel lights in blue when the power is turned on, and off when the power switch is turned off.
- The maintenance process starts automatically even if you turn the power off.( P.4-17)

- If USB2.0 interface is not installed in your computer, ask a RIP maker near you or our branch office




### Notes on USB 2.0 Interface



- Your RIP must be compatible with USB 2.0.
- When two or more UJF-3042MkII/3042MkII EX/ 6042MkII machines are connected to one personal computer

When two or more UJF-3042MkII/3042MkII EX/6042MkII machines are connected to one personal computer, the personal computer may not recognize all the UJF-3042MkII/3042MkIIEX/6042MkII machines normally.

Reconnect the unrecognized UJF-3042MkII/3042MkII EX/6042MkII machine to another USB port, if available, and check to see if it is recognized.If the UJF-3042MkII/3042MkII EX/6042MkII machine is not recognized by the newly connected USB port, use USB 2.0 repeater cables available on the market.



### Notes on peripheral devices in USB high speed mode

When a peripheral device (USB memory or USB HDD) to be operated in USB high speed mode is connected to the same personal computer that a UJF-3042MkII/UJF-3042MkII EX/6042MkII machine is connected to, the USB device may not be recognized.

When UJF-3042MkII/6042MkII is connected to the personal computer to which an external HDD is connected via USB, the speed of data output to UJF-3042MkII/UJF-3042MkII EX/6042MkII may drop. That can cause the head unit to stop temporarily at the right or left end during printing.

### Removing USB memory

If a USB memory module is inserted in the personal computer to which a UJF-3042MkII/UJF-3042MkII EX/ 6042MkII machine is connected, click "Stop" in the "Safely Remove Hardware" window by following the instructions given there first and then remove the module.

Leaving a USB memory module inserted can cause [ERROR 10 COMMAND ERROR].

Copy the data onto the hard disk before outputting it for printing.



### Connecting the LAN cable

When connecting LAN cable, be sure to follow the note below:



- Surely insert LAN cable until clicking noise sounds.
- Do not plug in or unplug any cable during data transferring.

### **Printing Via a Network**

If printing via a network, you need to configure your network with the following environment.


If you configure it with an inappropriate environment, it could cause printing to stop.

- Use LAN cables that are category 6 or higher.
- Use a switching hub and PC that support 1000BASE-T.




- Set the PC sending the print data and the printer to the same network.
- · You cannot connect via a router.

If the PC or device connected to the printer is not 1000BASE-T, you cannot perform printing.

After connecting, check the following.

  - After turning on the machine, the lamp for the LAN connector will light up as follows.



- Be sure to connect the power cable plug to the grounded outlet, or it may cause fire or electric shock
- Take care not to damage, break or work upon the power cable. Or if putting a heavy thing on, heating, or pulling the power cable, the power cable can break to cause fire or electric shocks.

### Precautions at the time of setting the ink bottle

When setting the ink bottle, pay attention to the followings:



- Confirm the ink slot number and insert the ink bottle of the correct color.
- Insert the ink bottle securely all the way in the slot.
   Moreover, do not insert or pull out the bottle roughly.
- Insert the IC chip into the insertion hole on the ink supply unit.

### Caution in handling of ink bottles



- If you get ink in your eyes, immediately wash your eyes with a lot of clean running water for at least 15 minutes. In doing so, also wash the eyess to rinse ink away completely. Then, consult a doctor as soon as possible.
- Use genuine ink bottles for this machine. This
  machine functions by recognizing the genuine ink
  bottles. In case of troubles caused by modified ink
  bottles or the like, it shall be out of the warranty
  even within the warranty period.
- Store the ink bottle in a place not more than 1 m off the ground. If you store it in a place higher than 1 m, should the ink bottle fall, the cap may come off, spilling the ink.
- If the ink bottle is moved from a cold place to a warm place, leave it in the room temperature for three hours or more before using it.
- Make sure to store ink bottles in a cool and dark place.
- Store ink bottles and waste ink tank in a place that is out of the reach of children.
- Some component (photoinitiator) of the ink is toxic against aquatic organisms. Avoid leakage of it to natural water system or domestic waste water.
- Before using an ink bottle, be sure to read the Safety Data Sheet (SDS).
- Request an industrial waste processor for processing of empty ink bottles.




- Do not shake ink bottles violently. This may result in ink leakage from the ink bottles.
- Never refill the ink bottles with ink. This may result in troubles.
   MIMAKI will not bear any responsibility for any

damage caused by the use of the ink bottles refilled with ink.

Do not touch or stain the contacts of the IC chip.
 This may cause damages on printed circuit boards



 The shape of an ink bottle installed in the machine might collapse as shown in the figure on the right.
 This is normal, and does not affect the use or operation of the machine.



- If you shake it too strong, it may cause ink leakage. Therefore, perform this carefully.
- If the remaining amount of ink is less, ink in the bottle cannot be beaten enough. Tilt the ink bottle until it becomes vertical.

When you press the **ENTER** key in LOCAL mode, you can check the bottle to be replaced in the local guidance.


### If the light-blocking cover comes off



### About ink expiration date

The ink expiration date is indicated on the Ink bottle. Expired ink may cause printing defects or alter the color tone. Printing is possible even if the ink has passed its expiration date. Nevertheless, we recommend replacing with new ink or use up as quickly as possible.

### Ex.) The expiration date is April 2020

May: Replace with new ink or use up as quickly as possible. Printing is possible.

June: (LED Yellow Lighting) Replace with new ink or use up as quickly as possible. Printing is possible.

July: (LED Red Flashing) Printing is not possible.



• The message appears on the display.

### About ink end and ink near end


When very little ink remains in the ink bottle, the warning message "INK NEAR END" appears. It is recommended that you replace the ink bottle with a new one as soon as you can.

When no ink remains in the ink bottle, the warning message "INK END" appears. Replace the ink bottle with a new one.

### For Ink bottle lamps

The condition of the ink bottles set in the machine is confirmable with lamps located over the ink bottles.

### Precautions in handling the media

Carefully observe the following when handling the media.



### · Extension and shrinkage of the media

Do not use the media in the sheet form shortly after the package was opened. The media could extend or shrink depending on the temperature and humidity inside the room. For more than 30 minutes after opening of the package, the media has to be exposed to the ambient air of the location it is to be used.

### · Warping of the media

As for the media of the sheet form, use the flat one, or the one warping downward (the one with floating central part when placed the printing surface facing upward.) Store the media liable to be warped on the slightly smaller platform or palette so that it may warp downward.

### Other precautions

- a Do not place any article on the surface of the coated paper. Some coated paper could change its color.
- b Curled media that cannot be absorbed or the media that misaligns when the table is moved may not be used. Before using, fix the media with adhesive tape, etc.
- **c** Do not use the media that will generate warping or deformation.

### Menu mode

This machine has three modes. Each mode is described below.

### Local

Local is a mode in printing preparation state.

All keys are available.

Receiving of data from the computer is allowed, however, printing is not executed.

The following operations are allowed in the local.

- (1) Setting an origin and the table height by pressing the JOG keys.
- (2) Executing "Test printing" by pressing the [FUNC2](TEST PRINT/CLEANING) key.
- (3) Executing "head cleaning" by pressing the [FUNC2](TEST PRING/CLEANING) key.
- (4) Execute setting of each function by pressing the [FUNC1](MENU) key.

### Menu Mode

Press the [FUNC1](MENU) key during the Local Mode to call the Function Mode.

In this mode, you can configure various settings or carry out the maintenance process.

### Remote

Remote is a mode in printing received data.

Press the [FUNC3](REMOTE) key during printing to return to the local mode and temporarily stop the printing process.

Press the [FUNC3](REMOTE) during the Local Mode to switch to the Remote.

## **Chapter 2 Basic Operations**

### Turning the Power ON/OFF

### **Turning the Power ON**

This machine is provided with the following two power switches:

### Main power switch:

It is located on the side of this machine. Keep this switch ON all the time.

### [END/POWER] key :


Normally, use this key to turn the power ON/OFF.

The function for preventing ink sedimentation works even with the [END/POWER] key turned OFF when the main power switch is turned ON.

### Turn the main power switch ON.


 Set the main power switch located on the side of this machine to the "I" side.



 The firmware version is displayed when the power is turned ON, and then the machine performs its initial operation.



### Turn the power on, by pressing the <a href="END/POWER">END/POWER</a> key.





### Turn ON the power of the connected PC.



- Turn the power ON after the front cover and maintenance cover are closed.
- The head nozzle may result in nozzle clogging if the main power switch is left OFF for a long time.

### **Turning the Power OFF**

When having ended the operation of the machine, turn the power OFF by pressing the [END/POWER] key.

Check the following items when turning the power OFF.

- If the machine is receiving data from the PC or if there is any data that has not been output yet
- If the head has returned to the capping station
- If any error has occurred ( P.5-6 "Error messages")




### Turn OFF the power of the connected PC.



### Turn the power off, by giving the **END/POWER** key a long press.

- Do not turn OFF the main power switch located on the side of the machine.
- To use this machine again, press the [END/ POWER] key.



### **Cautions about Turning the Power OFF**

Do not turn the main power switch OFF.

When the main power switch is ON, the power periodically turns ON and the operation for preventing ink sedimentation is carried out.

When the main power switch has been turned OFF, the function for preventing ink sedimentation will not work, and this may cause nozzle clogging.

Keep the front cover and the maintenance cover closed.

If the cover is opened, the function for preventing ink sedimentation does not work.

Turn the power OFF after having checked the position of the head.

If the power is turned OFF in a state where the head has not returned to the capping station, the ink head dries, which may cause nozzle clogging.

In this case, turn the power ON again and check that the head has returned to the capping station, and then turn the power OFF.

- Do not turn the power OFF during printing. The head may not return to the capping station.
- After having turned the power switch OFF by pressing [END/POWER] key, turn the main power switch OFF.

When turning the main power switch off for moving the machine or for solving the error or the like, press the [END/POWER] key a long time on the front of the machine, check the display is turned off on the operation panel, and then turn the main power switch off

### Setting the media



 The peripheral parts of the media could roll up due to heat. Fix the media supplementary using adhesive tapes, etc.



### Setting the media thickness.

- (1) Press the [FUNC1] (MENU) → [▼] (1 time)
  → [ENTER] key in LOCAL mode.
- (2) Select "MEDIA THICKNESS", and press the [ENTER] key.
- (3) Press [▲][▼] to set the media thickness, and press the [ENTER] key.



- When using a jig, enter the jig's height + the media thickness.
- Place the media so that concentrated load is prevented.

### **Setting the Table Height**

If the table height is changed, Media Thickness is also changed.



Press the FUNC1 (MENU) →

[▼]→ ENTER key in LOCAL mode.

• HEAD HEIGHT MENU will be displayed.



Press to serect "TABLE HEIGHT", and press the ENTER key.



If more missing nozzles than A are eventually detected, continued printing will be deemed impossible and printing will stop.

## Printing Operations at "Nozzle Missing" Judgment and Error Occurrence

- When judged to be "Nozzle Missing"
- → Printing is stopped.
- When error occurs during nozzle check
- → Printing is stopped and "Printing Check" is automatically turned OFF. After recovering from the error, set "Printing Check" once again.

## **Setting the Printing Check**

Select "ON" when you want to conduct nozzle check at the start of online printing.

Press the FUNC1 (MENU) key in the local mode.

Press to select "Nozzle Check", then press the ENTER key

· The nozzle Check menu is displayed.

 The type of color changes depending on the ink set.

Press to set the number of nozzles for judgment, and then press the ENTER key.



# **Chapter 4 Maintenance**



#### This chapter

describes the items required to use this machine more comfortably, which are the methods for the daily care, the maintenance of the ink bottles etc.

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#### Routine maintenance

Be sure to conduct maintenance works for the machine depending on operation frequency or periodically so as to use the machine for a long time while keeping its drawing accuracy.

## When this machine is left unused for a long time

When the machine is not going to be used for a week or more, use the cleaning function for ink discharge passage( P.4-11). After this, keep the machine in custody.



- Use the machine with always turning "ON" the main power.
- · Remove the media being set.


#### Precautions in cleaning



 In case water or alcohol mixed into the UV curing ink (UV ink), flocculation would be occurred.
 Be sure not to adhere water or alcohol not only on the nozzle and also near the head.




- Never disassemble this machine. Disassembling this machine can result in electric shock hazards or damage to this machine.
- Prevent moisture from entering this machine.
   Moisture inside the machine can result in electric shock hazards or damage to this machine.
- Before starting maintenance work, be sure to turn off the main power switch and unplug the power cable; otherwise, an unexpected accident may occur
- Do not use benzine, thinner, or any chemical agent containing abrasives. Such materials can deteriorate or deform the surface of the covers.
- Do not apply lubricating oil or the like to any part inside this machine. Such materials can cause this machine mechanism to fail.



#### Cleaning exterior surfaces

If exterior surfaces of the machine is dirty, dampen a soft cloth with water or a neutral detergent diluted with water, squeeze it and wipe the surfaces.



#### Cleaning the table



• Turn off the main power and unplug the power cable before carrying out maintenance.

Continuing to use the dirty will also cause dried ink and attached dust to rub against the head nozzle and lead to print defects (e.g., nozzle clogging, deflection).




Do not allow liquids to get inside the product.
 Ingress of liquids into the product may lead to failure, electric shock, or fire.



- For heavy soiling, wipe using a soft cloth soaked in dilute detergent and thoroughly wrung out.
- Be sure to clean the slot on the frame of the table, the screw holes for holding tools or the like since dust and dirt are easily accumulated in these parts.



 If it is stained with ink, wipe it off with a paper towel containing a little amount of the cleaning solution.





#### About MAINTENANCE MENU

This provides various settings for doing maintenance on the machine. The following items can be set in Maintenance settings.



(FUNC1) : Press this to select MAINTENANCE MENU, or to switch to the previous screen.

(FUNC3) : Press this to switch to the next screen.

## Maintaining the Capping Station

Maintain the ink cap, wiper, etc. located in the capping station. (SATION MAINT.)



 To keep the nozzle status normal, perform wiper cleaning frequently.

The ink cap and wiper function as follows.

- Wiper : It wipes off ink sticking to the head nozzles.
- Ink cap: It prevents the head nozzles from clogging due to dryness.

As the machine is used repeatedly, the wiper and ink cap gradually become dirty with ink, dust, etc.

If nozzle missing cannot be corrected even after head cleaning ( P.2-8) has been performed, use a F-200 / LF-200 Washing Liquid kit and cleaning swab.

- Be sure to wear the included safety glasses and gloves when maintaining the capping station. Otherwise, you may get ink in your eyes.
- Do not move the carriage out of the capping station by hand. When it is desirable to move the carriage, press the [FUNK1] key to execute the carriage-out. ( P.4-6Steps 1 to 2)

#### **Cleaning the Wiper and Cap**

It is recommended that the wiper and cap be cleaned frequently in order to maintain the high image quality of the machine and keep the machine itself in good working order.



- Even if you cleaned the wiper, when Nozzle out or Ink dropping cannot be solved, try to replace the wiper
- If the wiper is extremely dirty or has a scratch or damage on it, replace the wiper(SPA-0271).

Wash the ink discharge passage regularly(about once a week) to prevent the head nozzles from clogging due to ink coagulation inside the passage.





- Use the machine with always turning "ON" the main power. The function preventing nozzle clogging operates automatically to protect the head of the nozzle.
- The head nozzle may result in nozzle clogging if the main power switch is left OFF for a long time.

#### Check the items on the right beforehand.

Is [NEAR END] or [INK END] displayed?

 The cleaning solution or ink is absorbed when the nozzles are washed.

At this time, if the state of "no ink" or "almost no ink" is detected, the nozzle washing operation cannot start.



 When the worning messages "Check waste ink" are indicated, check the waste ink tank, and then operate it, referring to P.4-19 "If a Waste Ink Tank Confirmation Message Appears" according to the situation.

## Cleaning the Ink Head and the Area around It

Because the ink head employs a very precise mechanism, due care needs to be taken when it is cleaned.

Using a cleaning swab, etc., rub off gelatinous ink or dust that may stick to the lower part of the slider and the area around the ink head. In doing so, never rub the nozzles of the head.

- Be sure to wear the included safety glasses and gloves when cleaning the area around the ink head.Otherwise, you may get ink in your eyes.
- The ink contains organic solvent. If you get the ink on your skin or in your eyes, wash it away with plenty of water immediately.

 When you perform maintenance manually, after manual maintenance is completed and when time set with the automatic maintenance function has passed, maintenance starts automatically.

- If an ink tank error occurs, the operation set by the Automatic Maintenance function is not performed.
   Replace the waste ink tank. ( P.4-19)
- During the execution of automatic maintenance, ink flows into the waste ink tank. Check the amount of ink in the waste ink tank every day, and discard the ink if necessary. ( P.4-20)

#### **Setting the Refreshing Intervals**

The refresh interval is set. Refresh is the operation to discharge some ink from the nozzle to prevent nozzle clogging.

#### If Check Wiper Waste Inktank Warning Appears

Ink sucked up by wiping during head cleaning and other processes is collected in the wiper waste ink tank at the rear right of the machine.

This machine keeps track of total waste ink levels from suction wiping and displays a warning prompting the user to check once waste ink levels reach a preset level.

This should be used as a guide for replacing the waste ink tank.



 A message is displayed when levels reach 60% (0.06 L) of the 0.1 L wiper waste ink tank.

#### Confirmation Message in LOCAL mode

The warning message "Check wiper waste inktank" is displayed.

Empty the wiper waste ink tank in accordance with "Discard wiper waste ink" ( P.4-21).

(Important!)

- · If you continue to use this machine without discarding waste ink, waste ink may overflow from the waste ink tank.

#### Note on refill



- When only water is supplied to the cooling water tank without antifreeze liquid, the water heating unit or head may be damaged due to freezing.
- When only antifreeze liquid is supplied to the cooling water tank without water, the machine does not work properly, and may cause an error.
- If water in the cooling water tank frequently becomes insufficient, contact your local distributor, our sales office, or service center.



 Dispose of the waste water mixed with antifreeze liquid pursuant to the regulations of your district.

#### Note on antifreeze mixed liquid



To make mixed liquid, be sure to use the potable water meeting one of the following conditions:

- Calcium content:
- 1 mg/100 ml (10 mg/L) or less
- Hardness : 60 mg/L or less
- Distilled water (Purified water)
- Water and antifreeze liquid compound ratio should be 2(water) to 1(Antifreeze liquid).
  - Or use our specialized antifreeze mixed liquid (SPC-0783).
- Use it within one week when you make mixed liquid. The mixed liquid that one week or more passed after it makes it is never used for this machine regardless of use/unused.
   Moreover, do not add to the mixed liquid newly

#### Precautions in handling the antifreeze liquid



• Be sure to wear the included safety glasses and gloves for handling the antifreeze liquid.



- Use the recommended antifreeze liquid(SPC-0394) by Mimaki. If not, the cooling device may be broken. (Supplied antifreeze liquid:1000cc x 2 bottles)
- Do not touch the antifreeze liquid directly. If the antifreeze liquid settles on your skin or clothes, immediately wash it off with soap and water. If you get antifreeze liquid in your eyes, immediately wash your eyes with a lot of clean water. Then, consult a doctor as soon as possible.
- · Store antifreeze liquid in a dark and cold place.
- Store antifreeze liquid in a place that is out of the reach of children.
- When discarding antifreeze liquid which is no longer needed, entrust them to an industrial waste disposal contractor, clarifying their contents.
- Before using antifreeze liquid, be sure to read the Safety Data Sheet (SDS).



- Prepare a tank with a cap to put in the waste water from cooling water tank.
- When water in the cooling water tank is low, a warning message "WATER LACK" is displayed. In this case, refill antifreeze water in the way shown as the next page.

#### Supplying antifreeze liquid

If an error of lack of water occurs, supply antifreeze liquid.


### Troubleshooting

Take appropriate actions as described below before taking the trouble as a failure.

If still the problem is not solved after troubleshooting, contact your local distributor, our sales office, or service center.

#### Power does not turn on


In most cases, this is due to improper connection of the power cable for the machine or computer. Check that the power cable is connected properly.



#### The machine does not start printing

This occurs when the data is not being transmitted to the machine properly.

It can also occur when the printing function does not work properly or the media is not set correctly.



#### Image quality is poor

This section describes the corrective actions to be taken in case the image quality is not satisfactory.

Take remedy for particular problems with image quality. If the remedy does not work, contact your local distributor, our sales office, or service center.

#### Nozzle is clogged

When nozzle missing is not dissolved even after the head cleaning referring to P.2-8, make sure the following operations.

- Wash the head nozzle by the operations of P.4-9.
- Recovery the nozzle by the operations of P.4-15

#### Ink bottle warning appears

If an ink bottle trouble is detected, a warning message appears.

None of printing, cleaning and all the other operations that use ink is available.

If an abnormality occurs, perform the following procedures:

 Check the ink amount in the ink bottle and if the ink amount is not enough, add ink.



 Once ink tank trouble is displayed, do not leave the ink bottle without replacing it for a long time; otherwise, the machine will lose the nozzle missing prevention function.

If nozzles are clogged, the machine must be repaired by MIMAKI's service engineer.

#### When the ink leakage occurs

In case of ink leakage, please turn off the main power, unplug the power cable and contact your local distributor, our sales office, or service center.

## Warning / Error Messages

If some trouble occurs, the buzzer sounds and the display shows a corresponding error message. Take an appropriate remedy for the displayed error.


